E. Financial Report

Mr. John Wilson explained that the Financial Report was the last report for the end of the Fiscal Year 2021. A few line items were over budget, but most line items were under budget. The City of Pass Christian numbers included repairs due to Hurricane Zeta as did The City of Long Beach along with additional unexpected repairs earlier in the Fiscal Year for The City of Long Beach.

Mr. Pund added Face Book stats for October 2021, reached over 21,000 residents, engagements were just under 1,300, and new followers were added.

G2a. Amendment to Pelican Wastes' Contract

Mr. John Wilson explained that the Amendment to Pelican Wastes' Contract involved changing language from "unlimited" verbiage to "8 cubic yards per route day".

Mr. Al Gombos made a motion to approve Amendment to Pelican Wastes' Contract, seconded by Supervisor Marlin Ladner for discussion.

Mr. Wilson explained that the amendment to the contract included adding two additional trucks and one roll off truck for route services. The amendment allows for continuous route services and the additional trucks will be required to handle future population growth.

G2b. Amendment to H20 Contract – Add debris collection with truck and crew

Mr. John Wilson explained that he would like to table Amendment to H20 Contract – Add debris collection with truck and crew. Mr. Wilson continued explaining that three quotes were received, one from Waste Management, one from Pelican Waste and one from H20. If Waste Management or Pelican Waste received award of the solid waste amendment, then current solid waste contracts could be amended for Waste Management and Pelican Waste. H20's current contract is not a solid waste contract and can not be amended. H20's quote would require processing through Procurement, in order, to meet solid waste guidelines set by the State, for a new separate solid waste contract. The H20 quote is most cost effective based on services of 40 hours a week every week. Currently, purchasing and receiving of vehicles and carts, has a six to twelve-month window. To meet the conditions set forth in a new contract, for January 2023, a new contract, involving on-call services, would need to be presented early 2022.

Mr. Al Gombos made a motion to reject proposal, seconded by Supervisor Marlin Ladner for discussion.

Mr. Al Gombos noted that in the first paragraph, "collection contract would specifically include very large piles", is not specific enough for "large piles" and construction debris, whether commercial or other, should not be subsidized. A solution exists for vacant lots. Mr. Gombos voiced that language is needed to specifically refer to specific situations and type of disposal to be removed off street. Mr. Gombos noted that from a purchasing standpoint, receiving quotes

from August 27, 2021, thru October 05, 2021, may rise concern because of the span of time for the three quotes. There may need to be consideration in purchasing guidelines for, "Add debris collection with truck and crew", including sealed bids or proposals that avoid distance between the dates of the quotes.

Mayor Andrew "Fofo" Gilich noted that the "table" motion was now a "rejection" motion.
