There being a quorum sufficient to transact business of the Authority, Mayor Billy Hewes, representing City of Gulfport, called the meeting to order. The following proceedings were had and done.

Mayor Billy Hewes opened the floor for public comments.

Mr. Al Gombos introduced grandson, Thomas Alexander. Thomas was attending the meeting for career day, a shadow to Mr. Gombos.

C. Approval of the Claims Docket dated February 18, 2021

Mayor Chipper McDermott requested confirmation on Digital and if Digital is for the S14 Project. Mr. John Wilson explained that Digital is not related to S14. Digital is related to GPS/Water Model updates including pressures. The CDBG S14 project is closed.

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E. Financial Report

Mr. John Wilson presented information on the January 2021 Financial Report. Elevated numbers were due to repairs from Hurricane Zeta. Member agencies charges for dumpsters

increased due to the need for dumpsters after the hurricane. A breakdown on dumpster charges can be calculated and presented to any member agency upon request.

Mr. Alan Lane explained that there was a keying error that may reflect increase, but the error should have been corrected. Alan added that the dumpster charges should be the same every month and increases are due to adding additional dumpsters, changing smaller dumpsters to larger dumpsters and/or additional hauls requested for emptying dumpsters. Alan will verify whether the keying error was corrected.

Mayor George Bass requested an email listing Long Beach sites of dumpster locations.

John explained Long Beach charges are for dumpsters and the county portion is for public works hauling to the land field and the debris hauling.

Supervisor, Marlin Ladner requested clarification on the Wastewater Treatment Plant/Saucier, Riverbend, Robinwood and interceptor.

John explained there is no type of work justifying the \$10,000 for Wastewater Treatment Plant/Saucier, Riverbend, Robinwood. John stated at the time the report was being prepared there were unanswered specifics to where the \$10,000 would be entered and the expense was coded in error to incorrect system.

Mr. Al Gombos questioned what do the asterisks on page 5 and 6 of the Financial Report - January 2021 mean?

John advised he would review the Financial Report - January 2021 with Cindy Breaux, CFO and return with corrections and specifics.

Mayor Billy Hewes noted a motion was not required but Spread to Minutes for corrected Financial Report-January 2021.

F. Marketing Report

Brett Pund, The Focus Group presented stats for Face Book - Across board increases in posts, ads, engagement, and likes in January 2021.

Brett added that Board Meetings stream live on face book.

G2a. Revised Wastewater O&M Benchmarks - Approval

Mr. John Wilson noted at the previous board meeting, approval was received for release of \$179,000 retainage to UP/H20. Recommendation was requested to change language on Benchmark Section 2.2.3.2 l)6) and 2.2.3.3 c)19) from "Report Major Equipment Failures" to "Report equipment failures involving safety, treatment process or compliance" within 4 hours for all wastewater facilities assigned under this contract. This change will provide greater clarity in benchmark review and assessment, effective January 1, 2021.

John continued to explain the change would only affect the document part of the contract. The fine will not change and the change is for all (3) three categories, as a clarifier. The (3) three components distinguish priority in emergency situations. John added UP/H20 has reviewed and approved the verbiage update.
