E2a. Solid Waste Proposal – Approval to Negotiate Contract

Mr. Al Gombos made motion to approve Solid Waste Proposal – Approval to Negotiate Contract, seconded by Supervisor Marlin Ladner, for discussion.

Mr. John Wilson explained that three proposals were received for the Solid Waste Contract. A proposal from Waste Management, a proposal from Pelican Waste and the third proposal received was from a company for the cart maintenance only. The company that bid on the cart maintenance failed to provide a bid bond resulting in an unresponsive bid. Mr. Wilson requested permission to negotiate the Solid Waste Contracts based on valid proposals received.

F. Executive Director's Report

Mayor George Bass turned the meeting over to Mayor Jimmy Rafferty.

Mr. John Wilson gave an update on the Long Beach project. Pipe and connection work is required at Menge Avenue including work required at the Johnson Pump Station, additional work is required involving capping and cutting work at the plant. Egress will be maintained for local residents and emergency personnel.

Mr. Wilson explained he visited a wastewater treatment plant in Decatur, AK that has used MBR Technology to retrofit the plant. As a result, the wastewater treatment plant flow has increased from 1.8 million gallons per day to 4.6 million gallons per day. A meeting for the North Gulfport Plant is scheduled for October 13, 2022, to review a plan for options that will assist in the increase of capacity for the North Gulfport Plant.
