# F2b. Declaration Emergency – 16" Watermain – Hwy 67 & Shriners

John Wilson explained Declaration Emergency 16" Watermain – Hwy 67 & Shriners. Tuesday, June 22, 2021, the 16" watermain required repairs immediately. The lines supply water to D'Iberville at the Big John tank and cts, and the mobile home park on Lamey Bridge Road. Protocol was followed for lift for boil water notice.

Mr. Al Gombos requested an explanation on reason for the watermain break.

Mr. John Wilson explained it is believed that lighting hit a tree that was next to the watermain line and it rippled down the pipe and split the line.

# F2h. Back Bay Mission Dumpsters and Trash Cans

Supervisor Connie Rockco explained she had complaints from Back Bay Mission that Back Bay Mission was informed by Waste Management that they could not have dumpsters and trash cans on site. Supervisor Rockco suggested requesting Waste Management to donate dumpsters and trash can services to Back Bay Mission.

Mr. Alan Lane explained there are multiple entities in the same area associated with Back Bay Mission. Some entities have dumpsters while others have trash cans. Mr. Lane agreed to contact Waste Management about the donation request for dumpsters and trash cans but noted he could not dictate actions of Waste Management for donations.

#### G. Executive Director's Report

Mr. John Wilson explained the S14 Forcemain Project is in place and awaiting pressure test. Riverbend is currently laying pipe for connection. Canal east/south side still requires work to complete. July 11, 2021 was the scheduled completion date, but there have been delays due to weather. The project is at 65% completion and under budget.

Long Beach Project 1 has been awarded, awaiting pre-construction meeting and notice to proceed.

Long Beach Project 2 Notice to Proceed has been issued and project begin date is estimated for the end of July, in order, to allow time for contractor to order and receive materials.
